SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ASSUMPTIONS**

Services Provided

The District was organized by Order and Decree of the District Court of Douglas County, Colorado on November 18, 2004, to provide financing for design, acquisition, construction and installation, relocation and redevelopment of essential public-purpose facilities such as water, streets, traffic and safety controls, parks, open space and recreation, sewer and drainage facilities, public transportation, and the operation and maintenance of the District. The District's service area is located entirely within the boundaries of the Town of Parker, Douglas County, Colorado.

The District has no employees and all administrative functions are contracted.

The District prepares its budget on the modified accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the requirements of Colorado Revised Statutes C.R.S. 29-1-105 using its best estimates as of the date of the budget hearing. These estimates are based on expected conditions and its expected course of actions. The assumptions disclosed herein are those that the District believes are significant to the budget. There will usually be differences between the budget and actual results, because events and circumstances frequently do not occur as expected, and those differences may be material.

Revenues

Developer Advance

The District is in the development stage. As such, operating and administrative expenditures are to be funded by the Developer. Developer advances are recorded as revenue for budget purposes with an obligation for future repayment when the District is financially able to reimburse the Developer from bond proceeds and other legally available revenue.

Expenditures

Administrative and Operating Expenditures

Administrative and operating expenditures include the estimated services necessary to maintain the District's administrative viability such as legal, accounting, insurance and other expenses.

Debts and Leases

The District has no operating or capital leases.

Reserve Funds

The District has not provided for an emergency reserve equal to at least 3% of the fiscal year spending as defined under TABOR because there is no revenue anticipated in 2025 other than advances from Developer.

This information is an integral part of the accompanying budget.
